This is the entrance sign for the Kiwanis Park. It features a vintage 1935 Kiwanis cast iron logo that will greet visitors as they visit the park to launch a canoe or kayak on the Antietam Creek for a quiet paddle, or to just enjoy the pavilion and watching the water.

The park will be dedicated in ceremonies on October 3rd, and will include the inauguration for the Monarch Butterfly as detailed in the last newsletter. A map depicting the location is below. The address is 371 Dynasty Drive.

You can be memorialized in a plaque mounted on the sign by making a \$100 or more contribution to The Hagerstown Kiwanis Foundation for that purpose. Ongoing club responsibilities for the park will include seasonal clean-ups; which can provide service hours for Key Clubs. There is already an interest from an Eagle Scout Candidate to perform a service

project on site connected to the Monarch Butterfly Way Station.

Kiwanians are urged to participate in the dedication on Saturday October 3rd by attending the event, bringing or encouraging other to bring canoes or kayaks to launch (preferably before 10 AM), and help with the cook-out, which will feature hotdogs, chips, and sodas.

The Kiwanis Park is the first real step towards opening Antietam Creek to public access within the City of Hagerstown limits.
